

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: 12-22, 26-30 Waimarie St & 37 Glover Road, St Heliers, Auckland

<u>PURSUANT TO</u> Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Smith Cranes Limited, notification of intention to operate a crane at 12-22, 26-30 Waimarie St & 37 Glover Road, St Heliers, Auckland, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE, I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

- 1. The crane operating within the proposed area shall be lit with an appropriate obstacle light in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part77, Appendix B at both the highest point of the jib and the mid-boom; and
- 2. Smith Cranes Limited shall liaise directly with CAA (Iain Fraser M 027 358 0403 or E aeronauticalservices@caa.govt.nz) prior to the start date so that Aeropath can be notified to adjust the NZMB Instrument Flight Procedures for the duration of the crane operation; and
- 3. Smith Cranes Limited shall contact Aeropath (https://www.aeropath.aero/ Att: Phil Bickerton) when the crane operation is no longer required so that the necessary AIP charts can be adjusted back to normal; and
- 4. Smith Cranes Limited shall advise the CAA when the crane operating at the Waimarie and Glover Road site is no longer required.

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on 14 Mar 21 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.
