



NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: 77 Queen Victoria Street, Motueka.

PURSUANT TO Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Coldstore Construction 2008 Ltd, notification of intention to operate a Crane at 77 Queen Victoria Street, Motueka, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

1. Coldstore Construction 2008 Limited shall contact Tasman District Council in advance (Jane Park 03-543 8434) to raise a NOTAM for the period of the crane operation, of approximately two months, specifying that crane operations are in hours of daylight only; and
2. At least 1 day prior to each day of crane operations, Coldstore Construction 2008 Limited is to liaise directly with the Chief Pilot of Nelson Flying School (Brad Keay 03-528 8382) in order to coordinate the crane activity with daily flying activities at Nelson Aviation College; and
3. The crane shall be operated in daylight only; and
4. The crane shall be lowered when not in use; and
5. The crane shall be lit with an appropriate obstacle light in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part 77, Appendix B; and
6. Coldstore Construction 2008 Limited is to advise the CAA when the crane operating at the Queen Victoria Street site is no longer required.

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on 19 January 2021 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.
