Objective

The objective of amendment 4 to Part 47 is to implement the amendments to the Civil Aviation Rules in accordance with Part 2 of Schedule 2 to the Civil Aviation (Cape Town Convention and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2010 as a consequence of the application of the Cape Town Convention and Aircraft Protocol.

Extent of consultation

This rule amendment is consequential to the amendments that have been made to the Civil Aviation Act 1990 as a result of the Civil Aviation (Cape Town Convention and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2010.

Insertion of Amendments

The amendment to the rules in this Part is reflected by the addition of new paragraph (c) to rule 47.69.

Effective date of rule

Amendment 4 to Part 47 comes into force by Order in Council on 1 November 2010.

Subpart B — Aircraft Registration and Certificate of Registration

Rule 47.69 is amended by the addition of new paragraph (c): 47.69 Cancellation of registration

(c) Despite paragraph (a)(1), the holder of a certificate of registration may not request the Director to revoke the certificate of registration for the aircraft if the Authority has recorded an irrevocable de-registration and export request authorisation submitted under section 109 of the Act in relation to the aircraft.
